## Field Trip

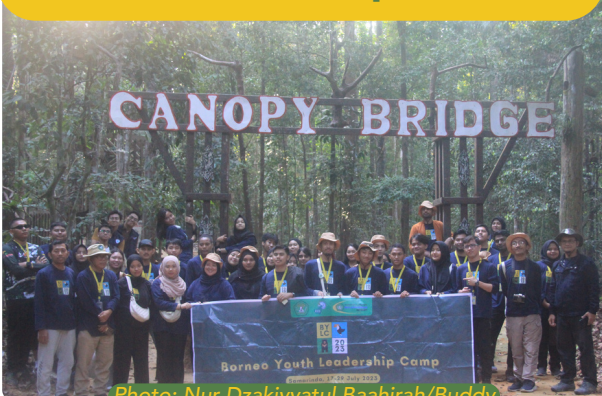

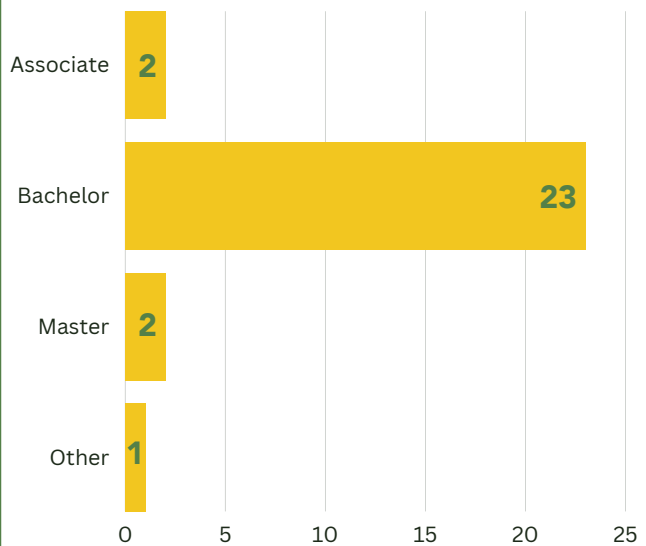
With 28 participants from 7 countries and 11 universities, this is an opportunity for participants with a common special interest or an informal social setting to exchange information and ideas.

## Based on Degree



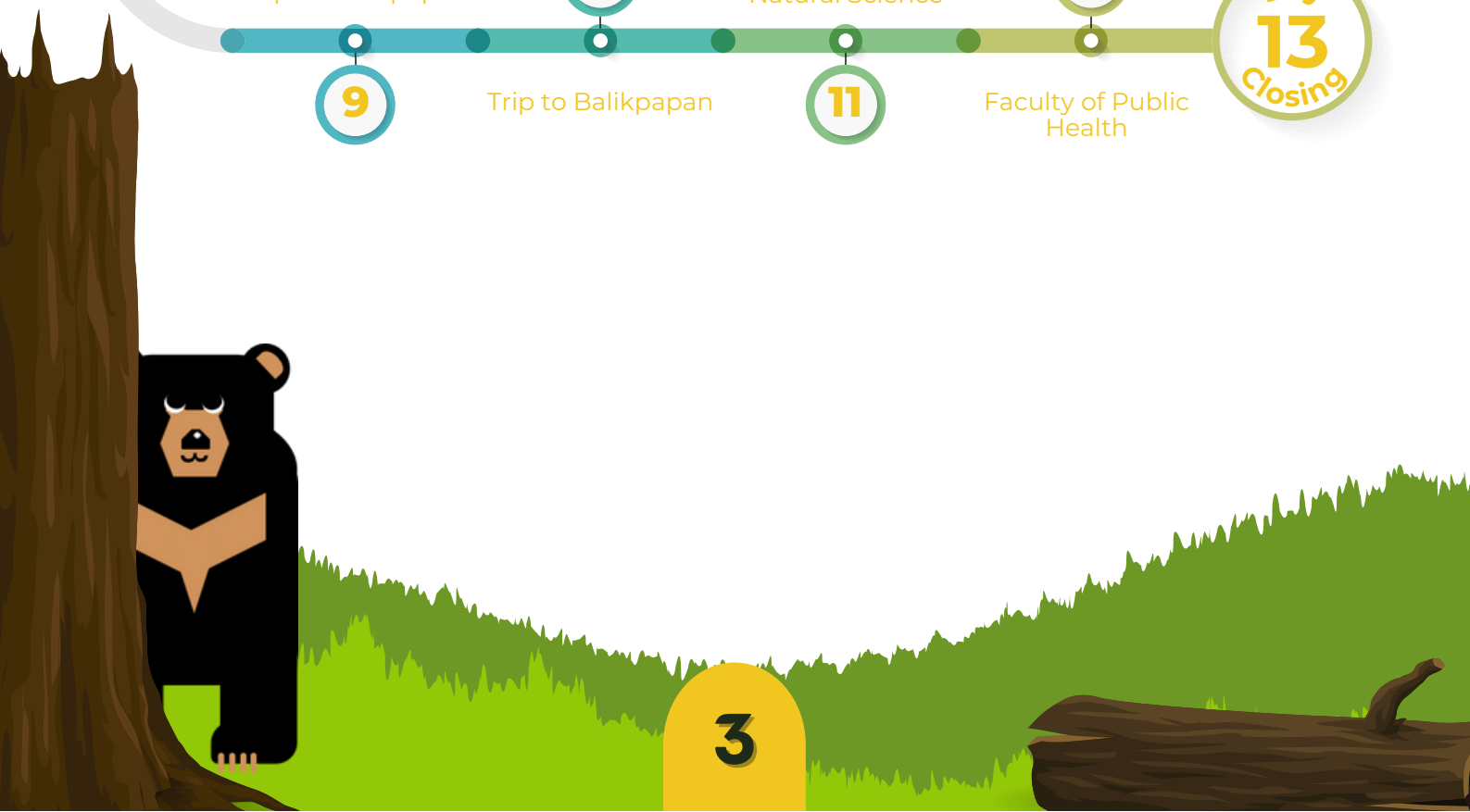
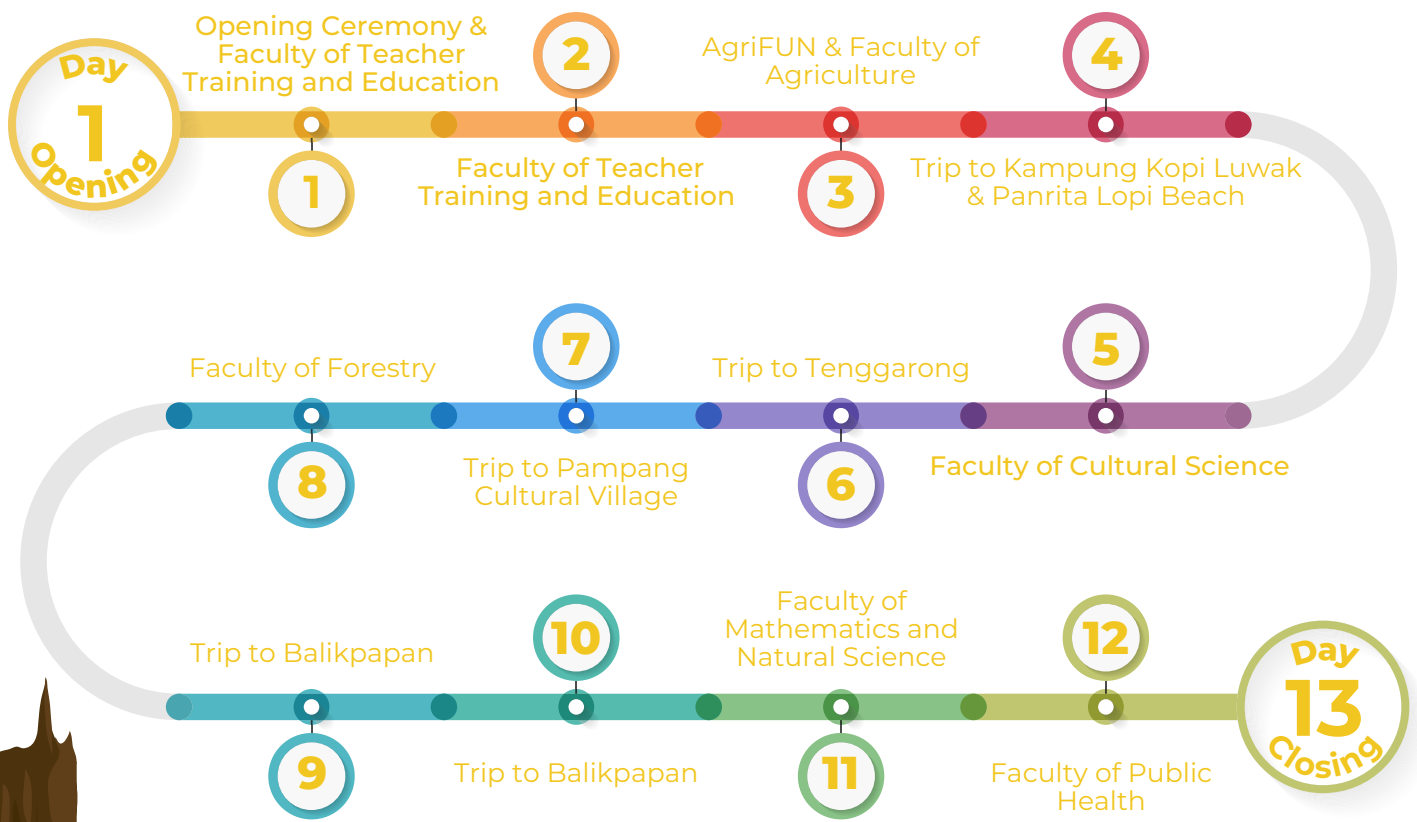
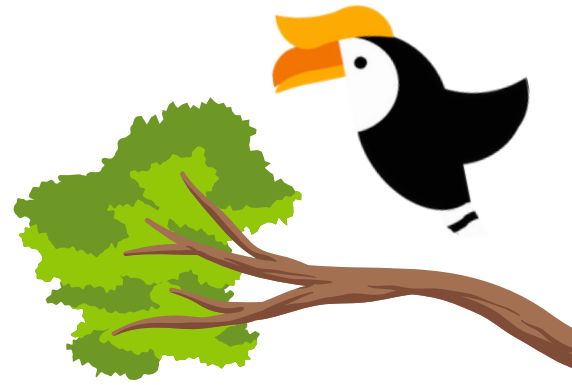

## Opening Ceremony of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023



Borneo Youth Leadership Camp is a Summer School event held by International Office Universitas Mulawarman on 17th – 29th July 2023. This opening ceremony was attended by the Rector of Universitas Mulawarman, Dr. Ir. H. Abdunnur, M. Si., IPU., Vice-Rector of Academic, Prof. Dr. Lambang Subagiyo, M.Si., Vice-Rector of General Affairs, Human Resources, and Finance, Ir. Sukartiningsih, M.Sc, Ph.D., IPU. Vice-Rector of Students Affairs and Alumni, Prof. Dr. H. Moh. Bahzar, M.Si., Several dean of faculty and head of unit in Universitas Mulawarman.

Opened by Traditional Dance of Kalimantan Timur titled “Lestari Alamku” which represents back to nature, danced by one of International Student Buddy, Muhammad Repadil, and his partner, Safitry Friandany. Both of them are students of Forestry, Universitas Mulawarman.

The first welcoming remarks were delivered by Sulistyo Prabowo, S.T.P, MP., M.P.H, Ph.D., head of the International Office of Universitas Mulawarman. As he welcomes the participants, he also emphasizes the plurality of this year’s exchange program by mentioning the country of origin of the participants one by one.

The second is from Dr. Rosnah Abdullah, The Head of the Borneo Studies Network as she shows appreciation as Unmul had the initiative to re-start the program after a lengthy struggle during the COVID pandemic and wishes the program to be able to provide the participants with leadership skills and hopes that the program could strengthen the ties of the member universities, also to introduce students from other universities to the Borneo Youth Leadership Camp exchange program.

The last speech comes from the Rector of Universitas Mulawarman, Dr. Ir. H. Abdunnur, M. Si., IPU, who said this program, Borneo Youth Leadership Camp, is a yearly program to give a chance to International Students to spend their summer studying about UNMUL and a little step for UNMUL being World Class University by building international networking. Mr. Abdunnur also greets the participants based on countries using their native language. The symbolic gesture of tapping the microphone three times marks the official opening of the event also with the draping of ID cards to two participants, Tashfeen Amir from Pakistan and Subira Kaserero from Tanzania as representative participants of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023.



## Laboratory Activities at Faculty of Teacher Training and Education



The Faculty of Teaching and Education is hosting the participants of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023 for two days, starting from the 17th to the 18th of July. The activities of the first day begin soon after the opening ceremony and the orientation session for the students. They went to the Faculty of Teaching and Education to attend the first lecture series, at first the participants received remarks from the Dean of the Faculty of Teacher Training and Education. After that, they're moving to Biology Education Laboratorium to learn how to make resin keychains and did laboratory experiments in Physics Education Laboratorium.

Move to the next day, there are some lab activities too. In the first labs they were doing a STEM activity, Water Turbidity Project. They are required to install a light meter application on their phone as a water measurement tool. Each time there is a change in water turbidity, they have to observe it. They were doing this in a group, and at the end of this lab they received Amplang as a gift.

In the next lab, participants are given the results of their keychains on the previous day, they can bring them home. Continued with a short course on terrariums, the participants have the opportunity to make terrariums on their own.

For the next agenda, they're practicing making eco-enzyme. Of course, before they're practicing there is a short course given.

At the end of the day, they're doing eco-print —a technique where plants, leaves, and flowers leave their shapes, color, and marks on fabric— the eco-print using a canvas tote bag as the media.



## AgriFUN and Making Indonesian “Gorengan” with Faculty of Agriculture



Day 3 of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp is hosted by the Faculty of Agriculture, the participants are going to Rice Fields placed on Giri Rejo, Samarinda. It's a 30-minute trip from Universitas Mulawarman. The day begins when participants are picked up from the dormitory to the Faculty of Agriculture using a bus to receive remarks from the Dean and a short description of the activity that they are going to do at Rice Fields.

Heading to Giri Rejo rice fields, participants are allowed to do some farmers' activities such as cultivating paddies on hijacked land and plowing unprepared land using hand tractors. At first, there were only a few participants that were interested in rice fields, but after seeing they were doing fine, all of the participants are trying to cultivate paddies. After that participants are heading to the cowshed to feed some cows using hay.

After some field activity, participants are heading back to the Faculty of Agriculture to learn how to make Cempedak Goreng —fried Cempedak covered by flour dough— and Sambal Mandai —spicy sauce processed from pickled Cempedak meat— in Agricultural Technology Laboratory. The participants are allowed to have a taste of Cempedak Goreng and Sambal Mandai.

## Kampung Kopi Luwak (Coffee Plantation) Visit



It's day 4 of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp, the participants are taking trips to Kampung Kopi Luwak —a coffee plantation, where they will learn how the coffee is produced and do some testers of coffee— placed on Desa Prangat Baru, Marangkayu. The events were opened by the Corporate Social Responsibility of PT. Pertamina Hulu Kalimantan Timur, a subsidiary of the biggest oil & gas company in Indonesia, PT. Pertamina is represented by Mr. Binto Iskandar Hasibuan Tobing, superintendent of production at Pertamina Hulu Kalimantan Timur. He says that Kampung Kopi Luwak is a Climate Village Program held by Corporate Social Responsibility of Pertamina, which received Corporate Social Responsibility Awards as a result of collaboration between PT. Pertamina Hulu Kalimantan Timur and Kampongeng Kopi Luwak said that the key to Climate Village Program's success happened because there is the involvement of some role that helps to active that, (1) the society, (2) the governance, and (3) the private sector.

After giving a presentation about PT. Pertamina Hulu Kalimantan Timur and their programs related to Corporate Social Responsibility, Mr. Binto received a certificate of appreciation as a speaker by Borneo Studies Networks for himself and PT. Pertamina Hulu Kalimantan Timur Daerah Operasi Bagian Utara (DOBU).

Next to the agendas, Mr. Rindoni, representing farmers of Kapak Prabu, Desa Prangat Baru, gives an informative speech about Kopi Luwak in Bahasa Indonesia, about the history of Liberica beans, where the beans of Liberica were spread, and the difference between Liberica, Robusta, and Arabica coffee beans. The speech was translated into English by one of the buddies, Nanda, so the information could be received by the participants. The participants were also invited to see the coffee tree and observe the coffee that was processed by Luwak.

At the end of activities, participants are served Liberica coffee that is made in two methods of brewing, Tubruk, and V60. Also, the participants are trying Soto Banjar as a lunch that is served by Kampung Kopi Luwak and received a paper bag that contains Indonesian traditional snacks.



## Coral Reef Conservation and Having Fun at Panrita Lopi Beach



Still on the 4th of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023, as we finished our agenda in Kampung Kopi Luwak, we're heading to the Panrita Lopi Beach to learn about coral reefs conservation presented by Faculty of Marine and Fisheries of Universitas Mulawarman, due to weather conditions, the demonstration of the activity is done onshore, and they were introduced to the ways on how to conserve coral reefs using transplantation method.

After finishing the short courses, the participants are directed by the Buddies to play some games, there are some games such as Group Chants, Samson and Delilah, and Opposite. The games are used to train their leadership and teamwork skills. But the games were stopped due to rain and continued after. The winner of each category was awarded a gift as a group.

When the games are finished, the participants are given time to do a free activity, many of them use that to take group photos and play around the beach. Soon after, we had dinner on the beach together, and then we head back to Samarinda.

## Get to Know Indonesian Heritages at Faculty of Cultural Sciences



Touchdown on the 5th day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023. After some trips, the schedules are heading back to lecture series in the Faculty of Cultural Science. At the beginning of the day, the agenda started with remarks from the Dean of Faculty of Cultural Science.

The participants are then invited to practice East Kalimantan traditional musical instruments, Gambus and Sape', but due to the limited number of instruments, only few participants can practice Gambus and the others were singing the song along in Acapella.

First, they are guided to sing the song by practicing the Do Re Mi Scale, and then to apply the scale on the song. After some practice, the participants are singing Dayak Kenyah songs titled Pabat Pibui —songs that tell a love story— accompanied by musical instruments such as Sape' and Gendang.

The next activity is that the participants are taught to dance to "Hudoq". They were taught about the footwork and the body movement of the dance and after some practices they started to dance in circular motion accompanied by the rhythm of Gendang.

After lunch break, the participants are once again invited to the courtyard of the faculty where they are introduced to “Lompat Tali” a traditional folk game that utilizes rubber bands tied together to form a line where players are jumping over.

By the end of the schedule, the participants are trying Indonesian iconic musical ensemble, Gamelan. At first, they are introduced to the unique pentatonic scale of Gamelan instruments, with each participant repeating the instructions to sing the notes along. Then they are guided to play the instruments based on the tempo set by the Gendang, and in the end it forms a simple but hypnotizing harmony of the ensemble, with the final note of the Gong perfectly symbolizes the wrap up for the day’s activities.



## Exploring East Kalimantan History at Tenggarong



For the 6th day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp, the students made a visit to the city of Tenggarong. Departing from the dormitory at 8 am, the Mulawarman Museum was the first destination we visited. The Mulawarman Museum is a cultural tourism object that contains knowledge about the History of the Monarchy of Kutai Kartanegara. During the visit to the museum, we were guided and explained about each collection in the museum.

The explanation was translated into English by one of the buddies, Fatima, so that the participant could better understand it. Historic collections in the Mulawarman Museum include Singgasana (throne), Traditional clothing, traditional weapons, ancient jewelry, Yupa inscriptions, Tenun (Woven from the Dayak tribe), traditional looms, Carvings typical of the Dayak tribe, Ceramics from several countries, and so on. After going through every collection of historic items in the Museum, the participants are going to the little market just behind the museum where they are buying souvenirs.

After the museum, we are heading to the Grand Mosque of Tenggarong or locally known as Masjid Agung. Since the majority of the participants are Muslim, to have some rest at the mosque is the best option because then they could pray while the others are having lunch at the place as well.

The visit to the mosque are also a great chance to showcase how culture and religion could blend in so well in Tenggarong, telling how plurality has become East Kalimantan’s unique quality.

Soon after the prayers and lunch are done, we are going to Ladang Budaya, an attraction with focus on outdoor activities. There, the participants are given freedom to explore and to be involved in any available attraction inside. The first group of participants are choosing to try Flying Fox, where they are being carried on top of a hill by a pick-up truck, and then descending on a steel line, going across the lake to land on a platform.

The second group are choosing to play paintball, where they are divided into two teams pitted against each other. At first it seems like they do not enjoy themselves as they stayed hiding, but it turns out that it is part of the strategy to save bullets and avoid getting shot by the opponents.

As it is already 4 and after a lengthy walk around the Museum and Ladaya, the participants are then heading back to the dormitory in Samarinda.



## Visiting Pampang Cultural Village as Samarinda Icon



Sunday (23/7), students of the Borneo Youth Leadership Camp visited Pampang Cultural Village. This village has become an iconic tourist destination in Samarinda City which continues to uphold its ancestral culture. During this visit, we can witness the culture of East Kalimantan, especially the Dayak tribe, including traditional dances, traditional houses, fine arts, and local people's habits.

Pampang cultural village has a routine agenda in the form of traditional dance performances. This performance takes place at the Lamin Adat Pamung Tawai traditional house which starts at 2 pm, contains several Dayak's dances. These traditional dances are performed by local residents with various age groups, from children, youth to adults. In this show, we can interact directly with the dancers and join in the dancing. Each dance movement has its own philosophical value.

On that day, the Lamin Adat Pamung Tawai traditional house was visited by many visitors from abroad who also witnessed the performance. The agenda at the Pampang Cultural Village was closed with a group photo.

After that, we went to Citra Niaga. Citra Niaga has become the central trade area in Samarinda City. The place provides various souvenirs typical of East Kalimantan and several places to eat and cafes. Several BYLC students went around to shop for souvenirs, such as clothes, key chains, fridge magnets, cloth and more. In addition, there are also those who stop by Café Kong Djie to enjoy coffee drinks.

The agenda for the 7th day of BYLC ended with dinner at Mba Wanda's Ayam Kepruk which is located on Jalan Arif Rahman Hakim, Samarinda City.



## Wondering East Kalimantan Forest With Faculty of Forestry



After doing trips for 2 days in a row, on the 8th day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp participants are focusing back on the lecture series of the Faculty of Forestry. At the beginning of the day started with a welcome remark from the dean of the faculty of forestry, placing in Bengkirai Room, Faculty of Forestry, Universitas Mulawarman, and continued with the first lecture called “Wildlife Conservation on Tropical Rain Forest” presented by Dr. Rachmad Budiwijaya Suba, S.Hut, M.Sc. and second lecture called “Medicinal Plants from Tropical Rain Forest for Human Life” presented by Prof. Irawan Wijaya Kusuma, S.Hut, Ph.D.

For the next agenda, the participants are split up into three groups for laboratory visits, they visit 7 laboratories alternately. The laboratories are the Laboratory of Chemistry of Forest Product and Renewable Energy, Laboratory of Biology and Wood Preservation, Laboratory of Soil-Water Conservation and Climate, Laboratory of Silviculture (Laboratory of Forest Protection), Laboratory of Silviculture (Laboratory of Soil Sciences and Forest Nutrition), Ecology and Conservation of Tropical Forest Biodiversity, Forest Product Industry, and Testing Laboratory.

The day ends with a closing remark by the Faculty of Forestry and the participants are heading back to the dormitory.

## East Kalimantan Wildlife Tour to Balikpapan – Day 1



On the 9th day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023, participants are heading to Balikpapan to visit some places in order to introduce them to East Kalimantan wildlife, such as seeing Sun Bear, exploring mangrove conservation areas, and spending nights at Bangkirai Hills. We're heading to Sun Bear Conservation Centre as the first stop, luckily we were on time to see the sun bears due to their feeding time.

Some participants actively asked the guide, what is the name of the sun bears, what they eat, and many more. The guide also actively answered the questions given by participants. As the feeding time of the sun bears is already over, the participants are also moving to other areas of the enclosure to see the activity of sun bears, some sun bears are caught sleeping, and others are looking for other foods. After seeing the sun bears in the enclosure, the guide directed participants to the information center on sun bears. There is so much information about the sun bears, the sun bears distribution in the world, the evolution of sun bears, what sun bears eat, and much more. The activities end with a question and answer session in a gazebo-like building called "Lamin" and getting lunch and playing some games while waiting for lunchtime there before we head to the next place.

For the next place, we're going to the Mangrove Center in Graha Indah, Balikpapan. It's managed and self-funded by the local community, initiated by Mr. Gus Bei. He tells the history of the Mangrove Center Graha Indah, opens the question and answers session, introduces the mangrove nursery area, and lets us have a mangrove ride using a boat, but he tells us to wait until the water level is rising.

We're heading to Bangkirai Hills after our activity ends in the Mangrove Center. Due to road conditions, we arrived at Bangkirai Hills around 9 PM, which is a late dinner, but the participants seemed to enjoy it. That's the wrap for the first day!



## East Kalimantan Wildlife Tour to Balikpapan – Day 2



Continuing from the previous day, the participants of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023 started their morning with the forest freshness on the 10th day. Starting the day at 5 am to go hiking, reaching the Canopy Bridge inside Bangkirai Hills, the hike takes around 650 meters walk — 150 meters for track 1 and 500 meters for track 2— which is worth it because participants are waiting for the sunrise on the Canopy Bridge.

The participants are trying the Canopy Bridge in return due to its maximum person regulation. They are also taking pictures of the scenery from the bridge. There is also Rivai, one of the buddies that are on duty for taking individual shots of participants while they are crossing the bridge. Around 6.30 a.m one of the participants spotted Owa (Bornean white-bearded gibbon) hanging around the trees not far from the Canopy Bridge. They feel excited about it.

After all of the participants are trying the Canopy Bridge, we're heading back to the Cottages area to get breakfast, we use a different track on our way back, it is more uphill. So the participants need to hike carefully.

When we arrived at the cottage area, some of the participants were heading straight to the dining room to get breakfast. They also do some chit-chat while eating. There is not much phone usage because the electricity is blacked out in the morning, it is only available on night days and there is no signal there.

Some of the participants are outbound after finishing their breakfast, the outbound are very used muscular strength because they need to climb up to the trees and pass a rope course before they slide using flying fox and land on spider web to get down. So the participants are required to do warm-ups before going outbound.



## Learn and Practice with Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences



Exhausting trips on 2 days backward did not stop participants from continuing their lecture series on the 11th day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023. Today's lecture series starts later than usual. The participants are picked up from the dormitory at 10 a.m. heading to the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences. As usual, they were greeted by a welcoming speech on the 3rd floor of the Geophysics Laboratory, which continued with a presentation and demonstration about geology in East Kalimantan, especially rock fossils presented by a Physics major. In front of the desk where the participants sat, they served many rocks on the table.

Continuing after lunchtime, the participants are moving to the Basic Chemistry Laboratory to watch a presentation and demonstration and also practicing to do catalysis. The participants are doing 2 types of catalysis practice, the first one is practicing degradation of liquid waste using photo-thermal catalysis, and the second one is changing color using a catalyst that was presented by a Chemistry major.

Moving to the next practices, the participants are moving to Classroom to watch a presentation and practice their combinatorics by playing Hanoi of Tower, presented by a Mathematics major, the lucky participants are awarded a gift.

At the same place, the last lecture come from a Biology major, which introduced Kalimantan endemic fruit plan, such as Borneo Durians, Lai, and Jackfruit —or more known as Cempedak in Indonesian, which participants already taste at the Faculty of Agriculture after AgriFUN agenda— this lecture was more like fruit party because all of the participants are allowed to taste the fruits.

Today's lecture series ended with participant testimonials and documentation before they headed back to the dormitory.



## One Health Day with Faculty of Public Health



International course at the Faculty of Public Health, Mulawarman University, are the last agenda of the Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023's lecture series. Friday (28/7), the first activity of the participants at the Faculty of Public Health, Mulawarman University, was to walk through the Karang Mumus Green Walk to Cerdas Park. Karang Mumus Green Walk is a walking arena intended for pedestrians. This area is filled with trees on one side and there is the edge of the Karang Mumus river on the other side. On the way there, we were able to see first-hand the slum settlements on the banks of the Karang Mumus River. Participants were explained by lecturers from the Faculty of Public Health regarding the habits of local people who are at risk for health.

We also took photos and videos during the trip to Cerdas Park. Cerdas Park is one of the parks in the center of Samarinda city which aims to educate. In this park, there are jogging tracks, public sports equipment, statues, and miniatures of endemic animals from Kalimantan and Indonesia. After arriving there, BYLC participants were invited to eat healthy snacks that had been prepared by the Faculty of Public Health, Mulawarman University. There are corn, bananas, cassava, and various foods that are prepared by boiling. At Cerdas Park, we made introductions from the Vice Dean and Coordinator of the Study Program of the public health faculty of Mulawarman University and then took photos in front of the Pesut Mahakam (Mahakam Dolphin) statue before returning to campus.

Activities continued with health checks provided by the Faculty of Public Health, such as checking blood glucose, blood pressure, and body weight. After that, we were served healthy Indonesian food, called gado-gado. In this lecture, participants also received material about fire simulation in the workplace from the Occupational Health and Safety team and were shown and tried directly how to properly handle fire extinguishing.

Not only that, but we also play the game 'Yes or No' which adds insight into public health local wisdom of East Kalimantan—and also play attractive games with students of the Faculty of Public Health, Mulawarman University. The winners of the games were awarded books on various sciences in public health.

After returning from the Faculty of Public Health, Mulawarman University, the BYLC participants sailed by boat at the tourist boat dock. Not only the participants, buddies, and lecturers also sailed on Pesut Kita boats. We sail along the Mahakam River and see the sunset. We also took photos and had dinner on the ship. This joy sailing activity is on the agenda on the last day of the Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023.



## Closing Ceremony of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023



It's the last day of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp 2023, where the participants gather in the Theater Room of the Masjaya Building, not far from the dormitory. The closing ceremony started with remarks from Program Coordinator, Mrs. Dr. RR. Dirgarini Julia Nurlianti S., and introduce the participants to the people behind this program.

Continued with participant's impressions about this year of Borneo Youth Leadership Camp, represented by Hussain, and Rasyidah. There is also symbolic certificate awarding that is represented by one person based on their countries, Amal for representing Brunei Darussalam, Ain for representing Malaysia, Tashfeen for representing Pakistan, Hussain for representing Afghanistan, Shubby for representing Tanzania, Muffin for representing Indonesia, and Ploy for representing Thailand.

Coming up with the Best Participant announcement, which was received by Yelilan as the best participant due to his excitement, curiosity, and talkativeness among the programs. Among their speech and receiving awards, there is also video viewing from each group, to rewind the programs and to compete which group should receive awards as Best Group Video. There is also a speech from the Head of International Office Universitas Mulawarman, Mr. Sulistyo Prabowo, S.T.P, MP., M.P.H, Ph.D.

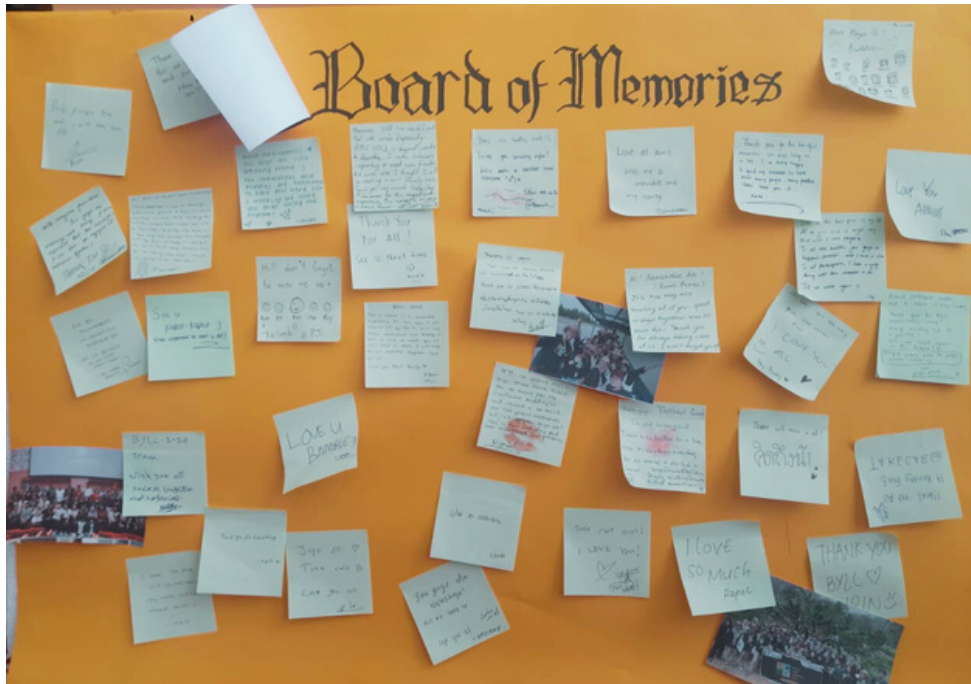

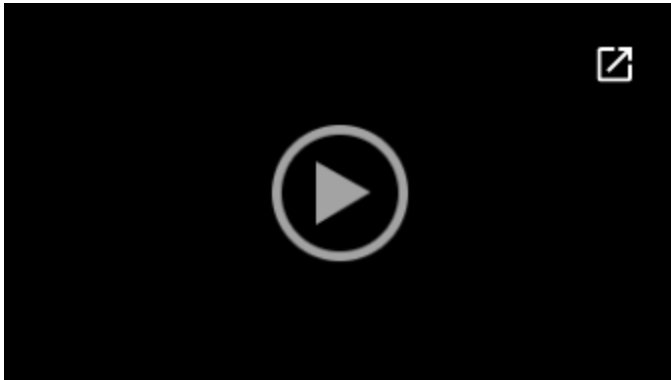

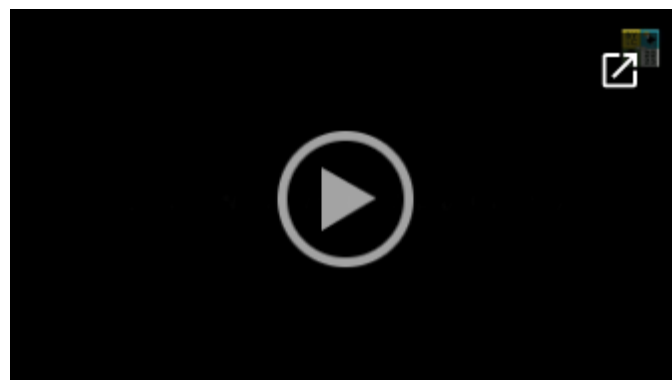
